


Are there enough transportation choices available for car owners to choose to drive alone less often and use an alternate mode?







70% of residents live within a 5-min walk of a bus stop, but Yolobus ridership is still low. What factors play a role for you? (select all that apply)




Have you ever completed a trip part of the way using Via, and another leg of your trip using another mode?






Less than 2% of residents report walking or biking for their regular commute. What factors play a role for you? (select all that apply)


New mobility choices allow for efficient trips. Which choices would you use if available in West Sac? (select all that apply)




Mobility hubs also provide public spaces. Which spaces would make it easier for you to choose sustainable transportation? (select all that apply)

- Feeder via Trips to a much more direct bus system
- Much safer pedestrian bicycle lanes.
- There is an opportunity to install light rail at this time before too much of the old rail rights of way are broken up by development.
- The bicycle access from south port and state streets to tower bridge is high risk especially under HWY 50 and barge canal bridge being especially hazardous.
- Allow more community grocery stores within walking distance of all residences.
- The Yolo bus system and the VIA program were working out --- but then they changed the way they are working, and it made it uncomfortable to get to and from destinations -- Changes are not always helpful.
